

KEMTILE IN PARADISE



A new fire station has been built in St Anne Street Liverpool to replace the one at Canning Place which was demolished as part of the Paradise Project.

Kemtile worked with Balfour Beatty the main contractors; they tiled the appliance room with 350 square meters of Pilkingtons Dorset Grey Steel with granular R13 slip resistant finish in 200x 100 mm. This was finished off with matching 100 mm high skirting. Kemtile also

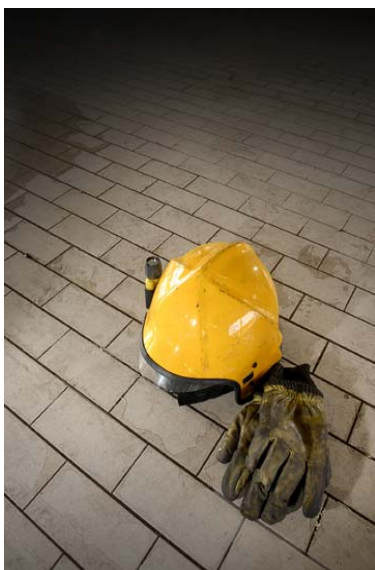


tiled the en-suite room and the petrol and oil store both with matching floor tiles and skirtings.

The tiles were fixed using Kageotec BS vibration based tiling system which is ideal for such a demanding environment. The system has high mechanical and load-bearing properties and each tile is encased in epoxy resin giving the floor superior chemical resistant properties. Kemtile is the exclusive UK applicator for Kageotec Tiling Systems engineered in Germany by Von Koetsveld and Grimberg GmbH.



Dorset Hexagon are robust tiles which are ideal for installation using the vibration fixing method. The tiles are classed as fully vitrified, which means they have a water absorption rate of below 0.5%, therefore spills of oil and diesel will not cause staining.
